Lights keep you alive

By law, you must have front and back lights

Lights aren't just for the night:

Use them in the RAIN, the FOG, the SNOW
and when the SUN IS LOW in the sky

You can be fined £30 PER MISSING LIGHT
– no lights means a fine of £60

Reflectors are not enough!

Excuses not to buy lights:

Excuse number 1

I won't be cycling in the dark

Yes you will! From October to March it gets dark before 5pm. In December it gets dark before 4pm.

And in any case, you need lights during the day when it's raining, or FOGGY or when the SUN IS GLARING on the wet road.

Excuse number 2

I have reflectors

Reflectors are not lights. You need reflectors as well, but you must still have lights.

Excuse number 3

I can't afford them right now

A set of front and back lights: £12

The police fine for not having them: £60

The law says lights are compulsory

– can you afford the £60 fine?
